It provides an improved user journey and advanced visualisations for more intuitive data analysis.

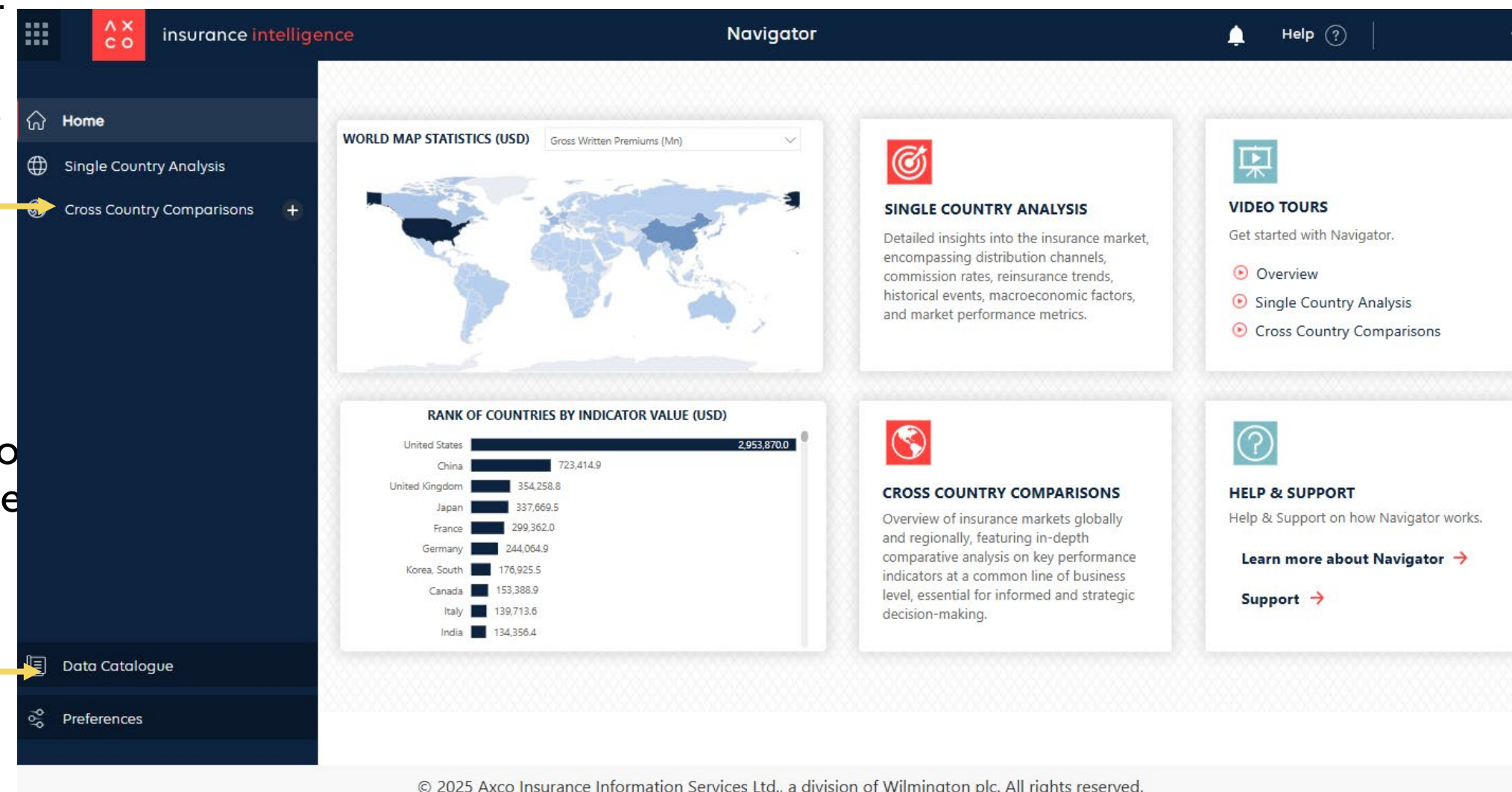
Home Screen:

Insurance market

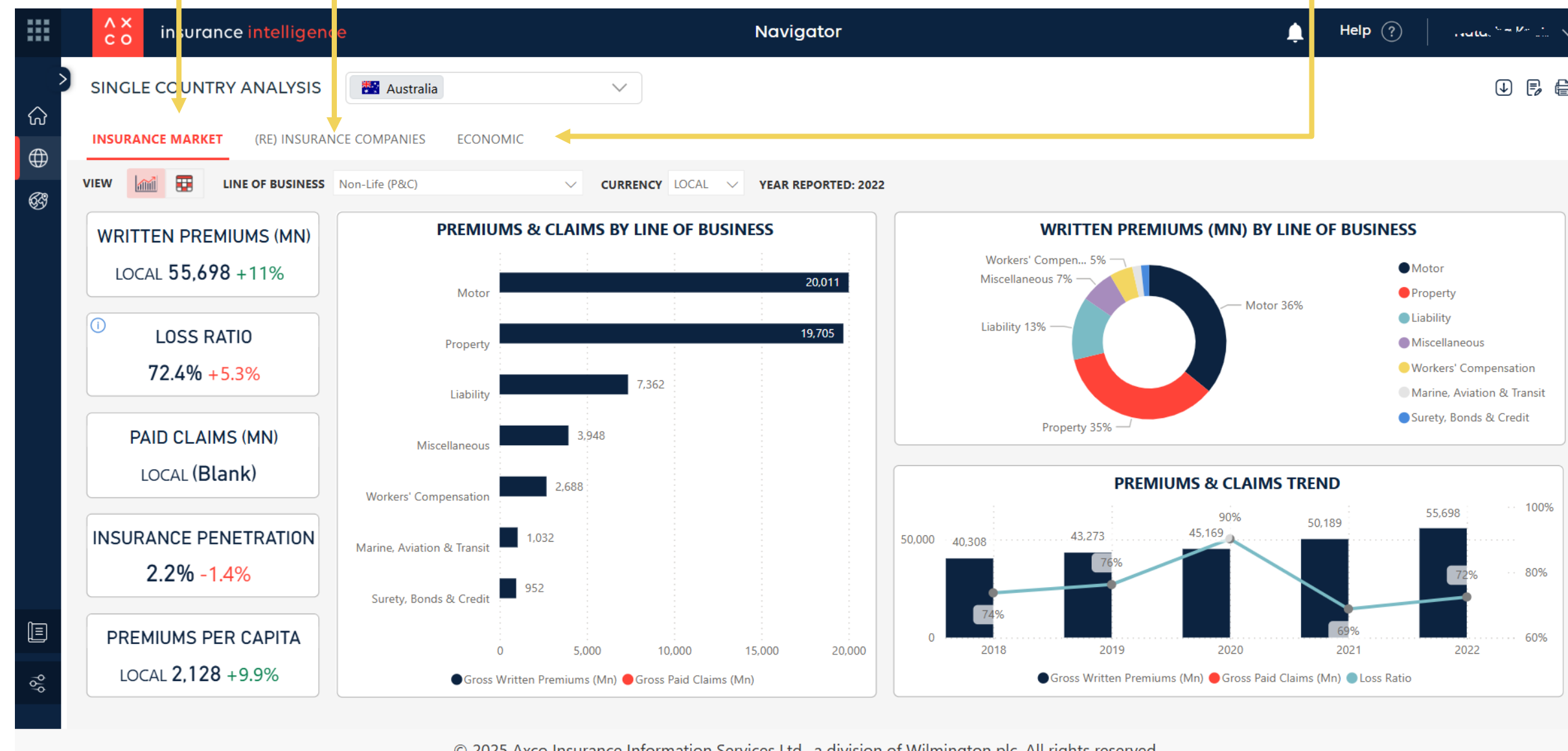

Understand the economic landscape with key macroeconomic indicators.



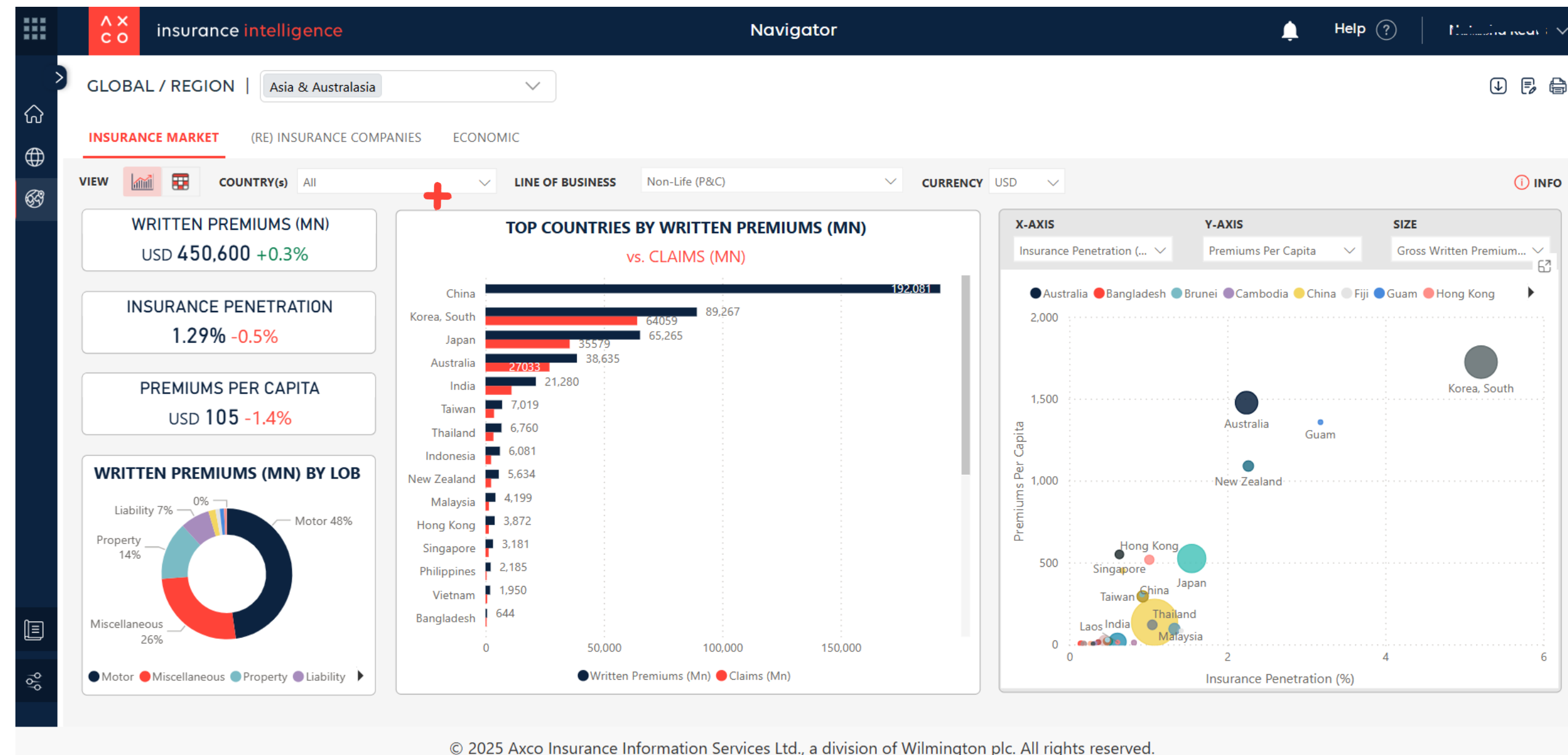

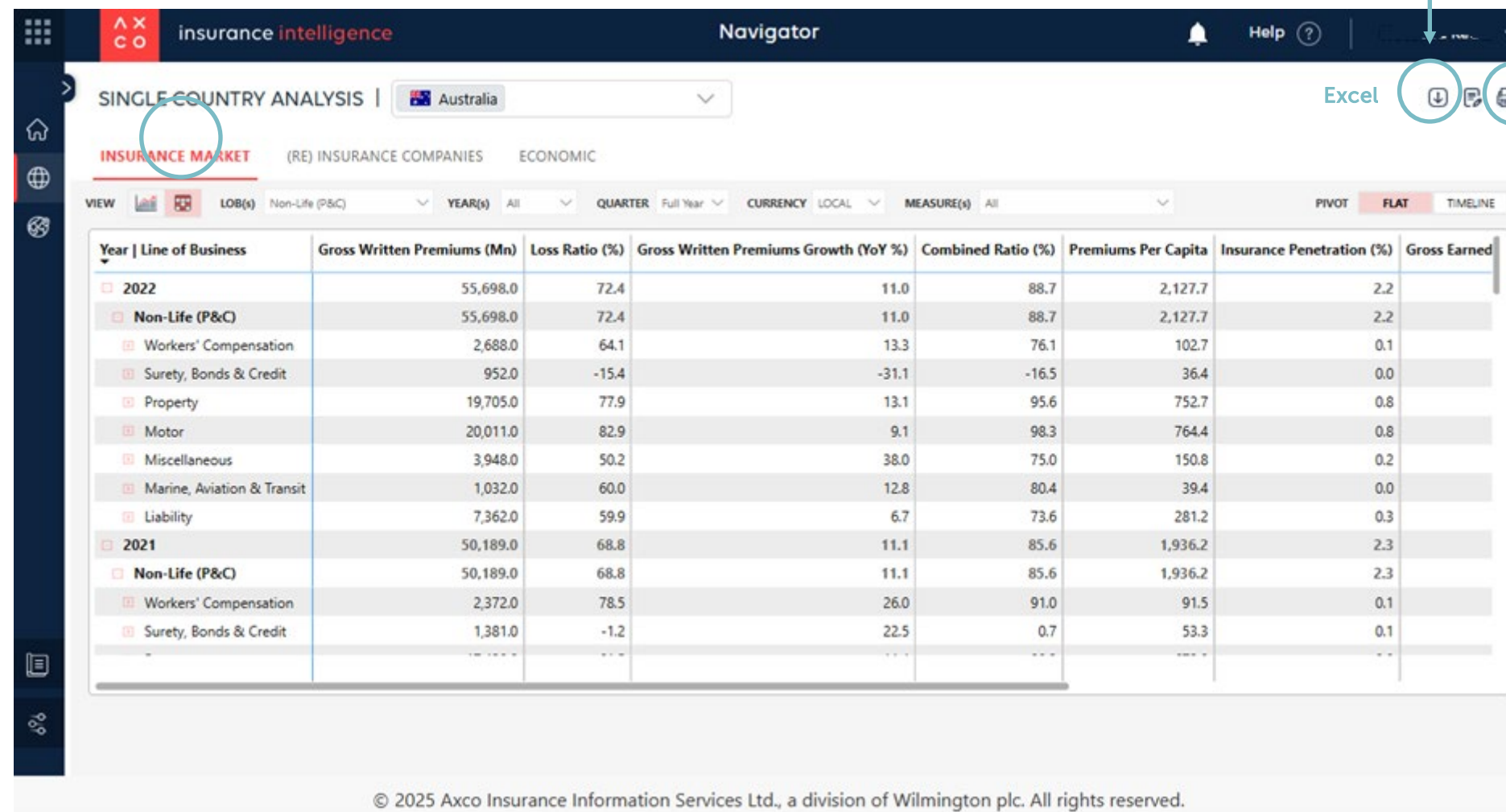


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Data Export
